

MERCER COUNTY CLERK'S OFFICE MOVES BACK TO SOUTH BROAD STREET

Renovations have finished being made to the Mercer County Courthouse Annex which was previously home to several offices including the Mercer County Clerk. The County Clerk's office will return to its permanent location at 209 South Broad Street starting July 27th and will reopen on July 31st. Safety concerns prompted the Mercer County Improvement Authority to make renovations to the courthouse annex with the approval of the County Freeholders. The Courthouse was built in 1909.

The Mercer County Clerk's office, which temporarily moved to 240 West State Street in January 2016, will be moving back to 209 South Broad Street on July 31st. Candidates filing school election petitions should still file School Election Petitions should file them at 240 West State Street on the 7th floor on Monday, July 30th by the 4pm deadline.

In the newly modernized Courthouse Annex, the Clerk's office will be providing services in similar fashion as it was conducted previously. The first floor is where you can record property, obtain a passport, register a small business, and be sworn in as a notary public. The second floor will be designated for Elections and County ID departments. The Mercer County Record Rooms, which is home to thousands of deeds, mortgages, and other essential records, will be on both the first and second floor of the annex. The passport office, however, will be separate from the other offices.

Mercer County Clerk, Paula Sollami Covello and her staff are committed to doing everything possible to make the transition as smooth as possible. "We will still provide the same fast and efficient services our constituents have grown accustomed to on West State Street," she said.

The public is encouraged to visit the renovated Courthouse Annex to obtain office services, including Vote-By-Mail ballots for the November general election.

Dear County Bar President and Members:

The New Jersey Judiciary has launched a website - the New Jersey Supreme Court Virtual Museum - that chronicles the state Supreme Court from the adoption of the current state constitution in 1947. The Virtual Museum was created and is maintained by the Supreme Court Historical Advisory Board, which Chief Justice Stuart Rabner formed to preserve the rich history of the state's highest court. The Virtual Museum, which can be viewed at https://www.njcourts.gov/courts/supreme/vm/scvirtual.html, includes speeches, correspondence, videos and photographs of the Court and key figures in its history. The site includes detailed biographical profiles of the first seven Chief Justices to serve under the 1947 New Jersey Constitution, biographies of deceased associate justices who have served since 1948, links to testimony before the New Jersey Constitutional Convention of 1947 Committee on the Judiciary - which drafted the judicial article of the current constitution - and the structure of the Judiciary before enactment of the 1947 Constitution.

New Jersey has had a Supreme Court since before it became a state in 1787. However, the Supreme Court did not become the state's highest appellate court until 1948. New Jersey's first constitution, in 1776, included a Court of Appeals, which was then the state's court of last resort. The state constitution of 1844 established the Court of Errors and Appeals as the state's highest court, deriving its name from its function of hearing appeals and correcting errors of lower courts. That court was abolished after voters approved the 1947 constitution establishing today's New Jersey Supreme Court, which held its first session in its courtroom in the Statehouse Annex in Trenton on September 15, 1948. Photographs of that courtroom and the adjoining conference room – both of which are now legislative hearing rooms - are featured on the Virtual Museum site.

In addition to maintaining the Virtual Museum, the Advisory Board's work includes short- and longterm projects; identifying, locating, and researching materials for the Court's collection; locating and collecting Court-related artifacts; identifying and placing markers or plaques on historically significant Court sites; commemorating significant historical anniversaries and publishing articles and books. The Advisory Board also recommends to the Supreme Court content and material for inclusion on the Virtual Museum website as well as the inclusion of notable cases and other legal events involving the New Jersey Judiciary.

The Supreme Court Historical Advisory Board is also working with the Rutgers Oral History Archives to conduct in-depth interviews of living former chief justices and associate justices. Chaired by retired Supreme Court Associate Justice James H. Coleman Jr., the Advisory Board is comprised of sitting and retired justices and judges as well as law school professors, deans, attorneys and others.

ECOURTS REMINDERS

- 1. Mandatory electronic filing via eCourts went into effect in the Mercer Vicinage Civil Part in July of 2017. As of April of 2018, the division has received 36,537 Civil Part documents filed electronically. The system is currently available to attorneys.
 - a. Self-represented litigants are not in eCourts. We receive requests to provide documents for parties not represented by counsel.
 - b. Please pay attention to the notifications provided by eCourts, as attorneys are responsible for serving all parties with documents in accordance with court rules.
- 2. Court staff is not authorized to alter or remove filed documents. It is the filer's responsibility to review submissions carefully prior to filing to avoid the unintended filing of documents.
 - a. Filers are responsible for redacting confidential identifiers from all submissions and for identifying documents that need to be filed on paper because of confidential or sealed information.
 - b. A court order is required to remove documents from the case jacket.
 - c. It is not possible to delete or redact portions of the documents. The attorney must submit the complete document to substitute a document with confidential identifiers field in eCourts.
- 3. Court staff is not authorized to return court fees based on erroneous or unintended filings. This includes papers filed in the wrong docket number, venue, or court, and duplicate filings.
 - a. If you have any questions about a filing, please call the case management office.
 - b. If you are having technical difficulties with the application, please call the eCourts Help Desk: 609.633.2275 or 800.343.7002
- 4. Attorneys must verify their contact information and make sure that the correct ID is linked to the charge account.

ECOURTS REMINDERS

HELPFUL TIPS

- Be sure to proofread documents prior to submission to the court.
- Be sure to select the correct documents to be filed.
- Be sure to select the correct party designation. If you are setting up a fictitious party, you MUST designate the party as fictitious. If you designate the fictitious part as a company or individual, R.1:13-7 dismissal notices will be generated. Staff is not able to change the designation.
- Be sure to read notifications on the screen while submitting documents.
- Do not upload documents to be sealed or documents to be filed in sealed cases. These should be filed in the case management office as paper filings. A court order is required to remove documents from public view in eCourts.
- If you are filing in paper, be sure to include a cover letter explaining why the submission is a paper filing.
- Be sure to review the notification as to which parties are receiving notice of your submissions via eCourts. Self-represented litigants do not receive notifications via eCourts. Parties are responsible for serving documents on all parties in the case.
- Courtesy copies of all motion related documents are required. Please be sure to indicate that the papers submitted are courtesy copies.
- If you have any questions related to filing documents in a particular case, please feel free to contact the Mercer Civil Case Management Office.
